The radical vision of a different world implies thinking and acting beyond the limits of the nation state. Consequently, radicals everywhere have built transnational networks of radical thought and activism – often as a consequence of being forced into exile – while at the same time engaging in national and local struggles. These international networks have not only enabled groups of radicals from all parts of the world to closely observe each other, respond to each other, and coordinate their activities. They have also provoked a rich history of border-crossings, entanglements and cross-cultural exchange and had a decisive impact on the political history of modernity. In this workshop we will talk about transnational politics of knowledge in general, discuss different examples of activist networks and contacts and link the findings to broader discussions about international revolutionary knowledge.
