From mid-19th century onwards a growing number of non-governmental organizations, intellectuals and policy-makers became concerned with 'vices' that appeared to pose a vital threat to national populations and even humanity at large, such as alcoholism, drug trade/abuse, prostitution and deviant sexual behaviors. The conference explores, firstly, how 'vices' were framed in the context of international bio-political discourses. Secondly, we seek to understand why the fight against intoxicating substances and venereal diseases became addressed as global issues. Finally, the conference addresses the question of regulation. Anti-vice activism was crucial in setting the agenda for both governmental interference and the making of international regulatory regimes.
